# Oil tanker operations at the terminal

- Pre-vessel arrival jetty inspections
- Safe management of the ship-shore interface
- Protection of the terminal from potential hazards associated with hydrocarbon transfers
- Identification of emergency situations and appropriate actions
- Management of the vessel's non-cargo handling operations such as storing, bunkering and repairs, ensuring operations and 'management of change' situations are safely completed
- Accurate recording of events ensuring that the terminal can defend demurrage claims where necessary and correctly issue, receive and handle the NOP.

## The lecturers

Course developer and lecturer Captain Carl Wass has over 40 years' experience in tankers and marine terminals. Working with Chevron Shipping since 1979, he retired from his final position as Marine Superintendent in 2009, having been responsible for terminals in Europe and Africa.
